The February General Membership Meeting continued the recent trend to hold in-person meetings at Camp along with the Zoom option for those wanting to join us online. FoCC was celebrating its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary and wanted to have an event at Camp to welcome generous supporters who have made us so successful. Camp Christopher wanted to host a memorial to those members of our Camp family lost during the pandemic, a situation that prevented the usual gatherings so important for closure. Camp brass reached out and said, "Why not do these two events together?"

The Memorial Day weekend "Gathering of Friends" on May 28 was a typical Camp cookout gathering with lots of activities culminating in Fr. Frank Basa's celebration of the Mass of the Ascension on the courts. (pictured below). As the liturgy ended, the names of 50 of our recently departed friends were read aloud before a moving butterfly release that made the grateful gathering look to the heavens.
